SNEHA (Society for Nutrition, Education and Health Action) is a Mumbai-based non-profit organization dedicated to improving the health, nutrition, and safety of women and children living in vulnerable urban informal settlements. Our mission is to empower urban women and children through integrated health and nutrition programs, education, and advocacy.

We work through a dual approach—engaging both care seekers and care providers. At the community level, we empower women and families to become agents of change, while simultaneously collaborating with public health and safety systems to drive sustainable improvements in urban health outcomes.

Today, SNEHA is a 500+ member organization with deep grassroots presence and a strong track record of reducing maternal and neonatal mortality, child malnutrition, adolescent anaemia, and gender-based violence—key determinants of health equity for families and communities.

- 4. To institutionalize palliative care by setting up palliative care OPDs in four tertiary hospitals of Mumbai and increase awareness, coverage, uptake of services and sustainability of the intervention model planned

CORE RESPONSIBILITIES

The Counsellor will be responsible for:

- 1. Offering immediate counseling services and support services to patients and care givers approaching the hospital OPD
- 2. Work in close collaboration with the Palliative care team
- 3. Going for home visits close to the hospital OPD
 Assist with navigating patients through the hospital, conducting palliative care awareness sessions at OPD's and among hospital staff, coordinating trainings in the hospital, patient documentation, patient referral and co-ordination between palliative and other OPD's
- 4. Networking with other service providing agencies in the interest of the patient and making appropriate referral
- 5. Attend and support monthly care givers support givers meeting
- 6. Administrative responsibility of maintaining case records, registers, writing Referral letters, writing minutes etc.
- 7. Preparing case studies.

MANAGEMENT & REPORTING

- 1. Coordinate on a daily basis with the Palliative Care team of Doctors, Nurses and Volunteers in
- 2. Connection with patients and care givers
- 3. Report weekly to the consultant Advisor
- 4. Manage data capture, storage, analysis and reports.
