COMPREHENSIVE OVERVIEW OF THE POSITION

The Nurse plays a key role in the **nurse-driven palliative care team** and serves as the first point of contact for patients and their families. The role involves providing nursing and emotional care using current palliative care practices, supporting patients through OPD and home visits, and training family members in home-based patient care. The Nurse is also responsible for electronic documentation of patient records and contributes to training nurses and nurse aides on palliative care.

CORE RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Provide nursing support including dressing and wound management.
- Conduct home visits along with the palliative care team.
- Provide emotional care and support to patients and their families.
- Train caregivers and build their skills and confidence in providing home-based patient care, including feeding, wound care, back-care, catheter care, tracheostomy, colostomy care, etc.
- Maintain electronic documentation of patient records.
- Support trainings and research activities of the centre.
- Conduct training for nurses and nurse aides on palliative care.
- Attend palliative care OPDs in other hospitals whenever required.
